




Instructions:

The Rising Sophomore Abroad Program (RSAP) is a study abroad opportunity for engineering students at the end of their first year. The program has two components: a spring semester course and one to two weeks of international travel.

Accepted students must register for the course ENGE 1644 (Global Engineering Practice: Leadership and Culture). It will meet twice weekly during the Spring 2019 semester. The course is designed to introduce students to global engineering, emphasize the importance of cultural competency for engineers, and focus on how differences in cultural, social and economic contexts influence engineering.

The program then culminates with travel to one of nine international tracks. Travel will take place very shortly after Spring 2019 final exams. Below is the the list of the nine tracks offered for RSAP2019. You will be asked to rank your preference for these tracks in this application.

- Beijing and Shanghai, China (2 weeks)
   Dominican Republic (1 week with a service learning focus)
   United Kingdom and Ireland (2 weeks)

Cost of the program varies by international track. Costs include the program fee, airfare, lodging, in-country transportation, company visits, admission fees to major attractions, guided tours, and some group meals (see program descriptions for more details on what is included for each track). Not included in this fee is the cost of most functiones and dinners and personal expenses. Program costs for 2019 are expected to range from \$4,000 to \$4,300 for the 2 week international tracks and \$2,000 for the Dominican Republic.

Financial support is available to students on the basis of financial need. Applicants will be considered for such financial support at a later date, so we encourage you to apply.

Final selection of participants will be based on applications, fall academic performance (with continued good academic standing in the spring), and continued good standing with respect to student conduct and honor code.
