SBIO 3984 Ireland: Culture, History, and Environment

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

This course explores how environment and history have shaped Irish culture, and helped define what it means to be Irish (and Irish/American). We will learn about the history of Ireland from ancient times to the possible impact of Brexit. Students will experience Celtic art as well as Irish language and music. Learning primarily will be through visiting and directly experiencing locations that are historically, culturally, and environmentally meaningful. Each day of the program will include hiking and/or other outdoor activities. The course will be based in coastal town of Bundoran, County Donegal, Ireland. All lodging and in-country transportation is provided as are breakfast and dinner meals. Also included are fun activities such as horseback riding or surfing and a high-ropes course.

- ◆ No prerequisites; open to all majors.
