NOTES for students and advisors:

- **Course transfers are not limited to the above.** Advisors can make reasonable substitutes on similar levels (i.e. within 34xx-level courses) as necessary, but these subs should be done after the student returns. (See below.)
- If a student plans on a course coming in to VT as anything other than the equivalents marked above, the advisor should pre-authorize the course as an elective on the level that the course will come in on (i.e. SPAN 3xxx) and make notes regarding the substitution that will take place later. Both the advisor and the student should keep notes regarding the subs they plan to make upon the student's return.
- If you want to transfer a class not already on this sheet, you should 1) ascertain that the course was taught before in the semester in which you plan on taking it (check here: <http://ssb.usfq.edu.ec/cursos.html>—“Primer semestre”=Fall, “Segundo semestre”=Spring); 2) contact the OPI office to get a copy of the syllabus (please ask the Ecuador faculty advisor for the email); 3) give a translated syllabus to your advisor in the discipline into which you hope to transfer the course; and 4) if the advisor approves the transfer, a short email to this effect should be sent to the Ecuador faculty advisor.
- When transferring courses into different colleges, you should plan on filling out a transfer sheet for each college with each respective advisor.
